Find Furniture That Fits

- SPLURGE AND SAVE. Pick your priorities and stick to them. While Kate splurged on some of her larger items, she also saved on statement lighting from Amazon and Target, and even discovered outdoor furniture that was a near match to higher priced designer items. Finding lookalikes is a great place to start, especially when decorating a new home or trying out a different design style. If an item doesn't hold up, then you know it's time to spend a little more for something you'll love.
- SEARCH FAR AND WIDE. Kate took her search to the next level; she went antiquing in Round Top, Texas, and furniture shopping in High Point, North Carolina. While your travels might be limited, your search doesn't have to be. Skimming through our own Sources page is a great way to discover niche design shops with online stores. Another good way to find unique pieces is to trace items on more popular websites back to their original source.
- STROLL AND SHOP ABOUT. In addition to her several-thousand-mile travels, Kate also shopped in the Benton Harbor area to find unique furniture and décor pieces. Shopping around in your surrounding area, you'll find pieces that reflect the environment and have a storied past that you can carry on. This tip is particularly useful when you're seeking specific pieces and wall décor for a lakeside cottage or wintertime cabin.

To maximize shared spaces, the team created a bunk room that sleeps up to eight children and a game room. Kate also took the creative liberty to make an entertaining space out of a former hallway, and with a little advice from her family, transformed the family room into a luxurious master bedroom. These structural renovations were the first step to transforming the already well-maintained cottage into a modern beauty.

"I would never do that in a typical home, but with the crazy high ceilings and wood-burning stove, it speaks cozy," she added.

The vintage stove and tub, in addition to the wood ceiling beams, enhance the rustic feeling in the room, while white linens and a woven chandelier add modern qualities to achieve a seamless balance. Who wouldn't want to retreat to this cozy abode after a beach day or a hike through the woods?

Before the fresh white paint, before the pops of color, Kate wanted to refresh the cottage exterior with new colors and new life; she traded pale yellow paint for a versatile navy blue, which looks great covered in a blanket of snow and surrounded by succulents and potted plants.
